## Commander Tom Parker



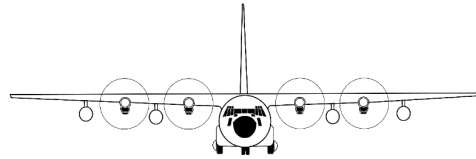

During the March meeting, Wayne Fischer spoke and alluded to the possibility of a memorial commemorating the 50th anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War. His words conjured up the memories that I had as a young man watching Marines evacuate the embassy as Saigon fell. A few years later when I became a Marine, I researched who the last Marine to leave Vietnam was and the story of the evacuation.

By the morning of 29 April 1975, it was estimated that approximately 10,000 people had gathered around the American Embassy, while 2500 evacuees were in the embassy and consular compounds. Marines cut down trees and moved vehicles to create an LZ in the embassy parking lot behind the Chancery building for the heavier CH-53's, while the UH-1's and CH-46 Sea Knights would use the rooftop as an LZ. An additional evacuation point for American civilian and Vietnamese evacuees was chosen at the DAO Compound adjacent to Tan Son Nhut Airport.

When the first CH-53's were sighted heading toward the DAO Compound at Tan Son Nhut, the OIC contacted the Seventh Fleet to advise them of his airlift requirements. Until that time, the fleet believed that all evacuees had been bussed from the Embassy to the DAO Compound and that only two helicopters would be required to evacuate the Ambassador and the Marines from the Embassy.

At 1700 hours on 29 April, the first CH-46 landed at the Embassy and began evacuations. Between 1900 and 2100 hours, additional Marines were airlifted from the DAO Compound to the Embassy to reinforce the perimeter, bringing the total number of Marines at the Embassy to 175. The evacuation from the DAO Compound was completed by about 1900 hours, after which all helicopters were routed to the Embassy. Operations were to cease at dark, however, with the ability to illuminate the LZ, and at the direction of the Oval Office, operations continued throughout the night. One CH-46 and one CH-53 were landing at the Embassy every 10 minutes and by 0215 hours, embassy personnel believed that another 19 lifts would complete the evacuation of the remaining 850 non-Americans and 225 Americans, which included the Marines and Ambassador Martin. President Gerald Ford ordered that no more than 19 lifts be allowed to complete the evacuation, but within two hours that number, plus some, had been completed.

At 0430 hours with the airlift limit already exceeded, the Marines were ordered to withdraw to the Chancery building rooftop LZ for evacuation. As the Marines moved toward the rooftop, they closed and bolted doors and locked grill gates as the crowd outside the embassy broke through the gates and into the compound. At 0458 hours, Ambassador Martin boarded a Marine CH-46 Sea Knight, call-sign "Lady Ace 09," and was flown to the USS Blue Ridge. When Lady Ace 09 transmitted "Tiger is out", those helicopters still flying, thought the mission was complete. This miscommunication resulted in delaying the evacuation of the remaining Marines from the embassy rooftop. After an anxious wait, a lone CH-46 arrived to evacuate the 11 remaining men of the Marine Security Guard. While attempting to takeoff from the embassy roof, the bird hopped three times which caused MSgt Juan J. Valdez to roll out the open ramp. He quickly clambered back on without any assistance, thus making him the last Marine to leave Vietnam. The Vietnam War was over.

Marine pilots accumulated 1,054 flight hours and flew 682 sorties throughout Operation Frequent Wind. They evacuated 978 U.S. and 1,120 Vietnamese and third-country nationals from the Embassy and 5,000 people from Tan Son Nhut. As a side note, the Post is honored to have as a member, one of the aircrew members involved in this historical operation.

This month we remember the 76th anniversary of the last major battle of WWII, and one of the bloodiest. On Easter Sunday 1945, the Navy's Fifth fleet and more than 180,000 Army and Marine Corps troops attacked the Pacific Island of Okinawa for a final push to what was going to be an invasion of mainland Japan. The attack was designated Operation Iceberg.

On the dawn of April 1, morale was low among U.S. troops as they awaited orders to execute what was expected to be a "massacre" worse than the landing at Normandy. But, to everyone's surprise, the Navy's bombardment in preparation for the landing was almost unnecessary, since little to no resistance was encountered. On D-Day, U.S. forces quickly took Kadena and Yontan airfields and moved inland with wave after wave of tanks, ammunition, supplies, and troops. U.S. military leadership wondered where they would encounter the estimated 130,000 Japanese soldiers, plus an unknown number of civilian conscripts, commanded by Lt Gen Mitsuri Ushijima. Little did they know that Japanese forces had been instructed not to fire on U.S. troops but wait and watch, allowing them to set up a massive ambush known as the Shuri defense line. In the days ahead, U.S. troops fought many fierce battles including clashes on Kakazu Ridge, Sugar Loaf Hill, Horseshoe Ridge, and Half Moon Hill. Casualties were immense on both sides by the time U.S. troops took Shiri Castle in late May. By then the Japanese were defeated but not yet beaten as they retreated to the southern coast of the island to make their last stand.

As the battles raged on land, the Navy's fleet scored one of its most strategic wins that sealed American victory in the Ryukyu atoll. On April 7, Japan's battleship Yamato was sent to launch a surprise attack on the Fifth Fleet and then annihilate American troops pinned down near the Shuri Line. Allied submarines spotted the Yamato and alerted the fleet who then launched a crippling air attack. The Yamato was bombarded and sank along with most of its crew. What followed however, squelched this important win, as Kamikaze warfare ensued. Suicidal trained pilots flew Japanese aircraft at speeds of 500 mph into the Fifth Fleet, resulting in great damage. By the end of the campaign, the Fifth Fleet suffered 36 sunk ships, 368 damaged ships, 4,900 men killed or drowned, 4,800 men wounded, and 763 lost aircraft.

Most Japanese troops and Okinawan citizens mistakenly believed Americans took no prisoners and they'd be killed on the spot if captured. As a result, countless took their own lives. About 7,000 Japanese soldiers surrendered, but many chose death by suicide. When faced with the reality of a lost battle, General Ushijima and his Chief of Staff, General Cho, committed ritual suicide on June 22, effectively ending the Battle of Okinawa.

Both sides suffered great losses. There were approximately 49,000 Allied casualties, including 12,520 Americans. Even the campaign commander, Army General Buckner, was killed in action on June 18, just days before the battle ended. Japanese losses were much greater with approximately 110,000 Japanese soldiers killed and an estimated 150,000 Okinawan citizens dead or missing. Winning the Battle of Okinawa put Allied forces within striking distance of Japan. This April 1, we remember our heroes of WWII, particularly those who fought bravely to bring the six-year war to an end.

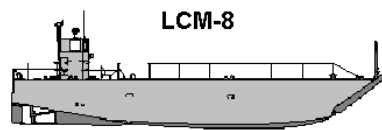
## Post Plant Sale by Marcy Maughan

1. [COVID-19](#) - Hines VA is now offering vaccines to veterans of all ages. To date, about 35% of the enrollees have been vaccinated. Also, some CBOC's are now offering the vaccine. Call the Central COVID-19 Scheduling number ((708) 202-2027 or (708) 202-7000) to make an appointment. Keep in mind that you must be enrolled in the VA Healthcare program to be eligible to get the vaccine.
2. [Hines Out Reach](#) - As a reminder, the Hines Outreach Team is now back in operation the first Tuesday of every month from 10 am to 2 pm. If you need help enrolling in VA health care, the Hines team can make it happen. Also, a representative from the State VFW Service Office department will be on hand to answer questions regarding benefits and claim applications.
3. [Planning your legacy](#) - The VA offers a Survivors and Burial Benefits Kit to assist veterans and their families with pre-need planning. The kit includes a section to guide you through possible end-of-life and survivors' benefits eligibility. Specifically, this project proposes to elevate Walter Strawn Drive to a bridge which will bring semi-trucks and all sorts of traffic within sight and sound of the second largest National Cemetery in the country. The increase in traffic is predicted to add 5,000 more semi-trucks per day, which is an additional truck every 15 seconds. There are many other viable options available for this project.
